

The Final Dental and Surgical Microcosm



This month, January of 2010, marks the 113th anniversary of the final issue of *The Dental and Surgical Microcosm*, or *D&SM*. As it had been from 1891 to 1897, all issues of the *D&SM* had been indexed and subtitled as "A *Quarterly Magazine*, *Devoted Chiefly to the Science of Anaesthesia and Anaesthetics.*" During its 6.5-yr publication run, *D&SM* was never challenged about its claim of having been "the first and only journal in the world devoted chiefly to the science of Anaesthesia."
