Anesthesia Clinical Practice Guidelines: A View through the Kaleidoscope

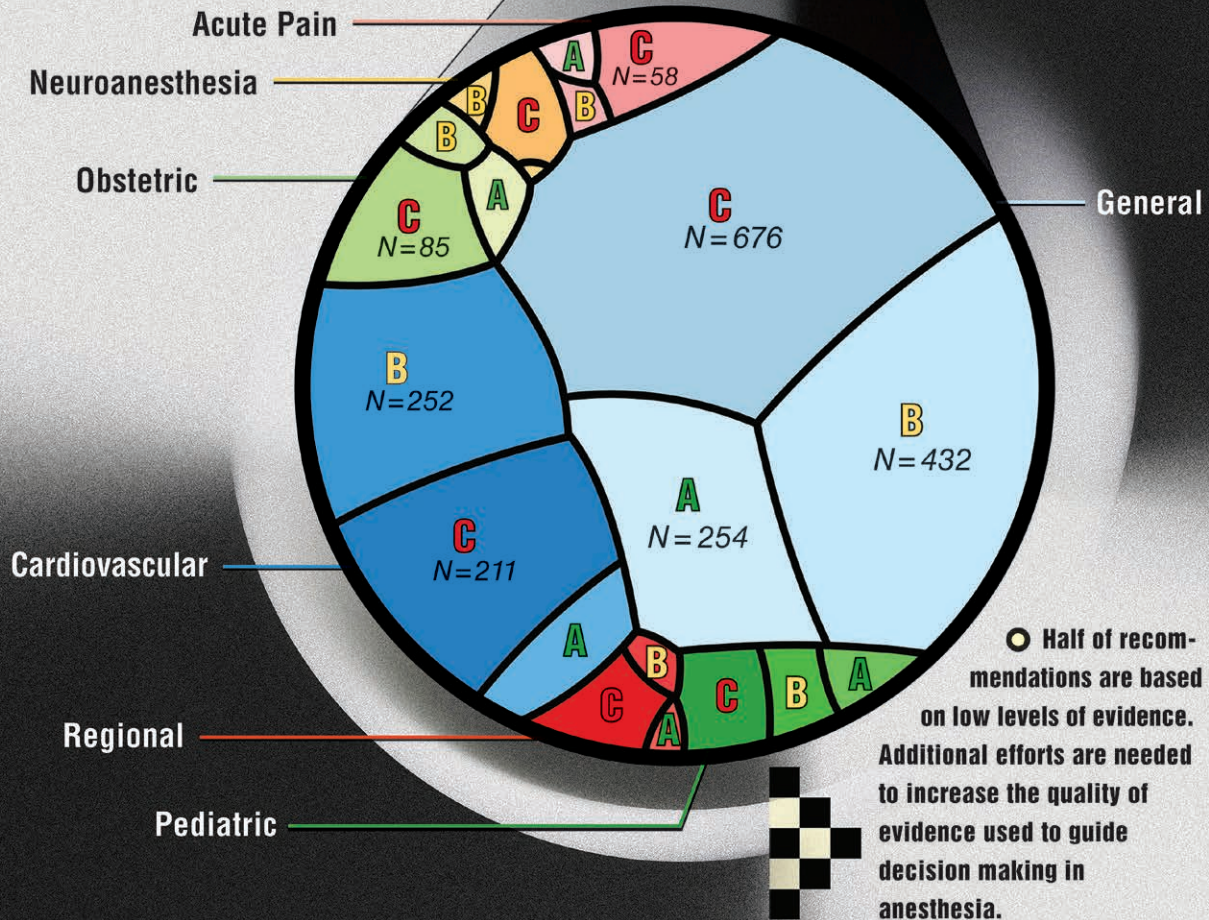
In this issue, Laserna *et al.*¹ reviewed 60 anesthesia clinical practice guidelines from 2010 to 2020, extracting **2,280** recommendations. The level of evidence was determined for each using the ACC/AHA or GRADE system.

LEVEL of EVIDENCE

Level A – Data from multiple randomized clinical trials

Level B – Data from single RCT or nonrandomized trial

Level C – Expert opinion, case series or case reports
