OPIATE ANTAGONISTS Five cases of overdosage of levallorphan are reported when the dosage usually used for nalorphine was mistakenly ordered for levallorphan. Respiratory paralysis followed; in three patients, artificial respiration was used, whereas in two patients opiates were used successfully to antagonize the depressant effect of the levallorphan.
