Drugs

COFFEE HABITUATION Casseine and a placebo were given in a blind study to 18 housewives who were not cossee drinkers and to 33 who were habituated to cossee. Criteria of casseine effects were evaluated on a self-rating form. There were major differences between the effects of casseine in abstainers and casseine users. Casseine abstainers reacted negatively to casseine, with the principal complaint of nervousness. Users complained of sleepiness and dysphoria after the placebo and reacted positively to casseine, reporting increased alertness and decreased irritability.
